Fishing the ANSA 12th month competition 2017/18

All members please note that our famous fishing club turns 50 years old towards the end of next year. A first for any ANSA NSW club.

A sub-committee has been formed to celebrate this special occasion. All past and present members will be invited.

The perfect scenario to add to our 50th celebrations would be for St. George to win the ANSA 12 month comp. This achievement won't be easy. Members need to get together sort out who can fish where, when and with what tackle etc etc.

I believe several captains need to be appointed who in turn will organise their team to target specific fish.

The rules need to be learnt—copy attached to this newsletter--all winning fish over the last 5 yrs needs to discussed and dissected.

A limited number of copies will be available at the next club meeting.

I urge all members to participate even if it only to pass on knowledge.

WHAT we know so far is the following.

- ANSA NSW conducts a 12 month fishing competition each year commencing 1st July (2017).
- There are 27 divisions, 25 of which points are earned for your club. The best 3 fish entered into each category are awarded points on a 3:2:1bases.
- So that's 25 divisions at 6 points per division equates to 150 points up for grabs. The winning club is the one that accumulates the most points 2017/2018 season.
- This year South Sydney fishing club won with 43 points and raised the trophy!!!
- This competition has developed over the years and now accommodates for all types of fisher persons.
- Large boats, tinnies, kayaks, floating rubber tubes, to water proof wading gear.
- Blue water game
- Enclosed and unenclosed waters.
- Beach and rock.
- Freshwater.
- Bait or lures.
- Line class or length only.
- Hand lines
- Fly fishing -salt or fresh water.
- Ladies, sub- Junior, junior boys and girls sections.
- From Carp to Cod
- From Albacore to Zebra fish
- From Sub -Junior to Senior
- From Wheel chair to Stand-up Game
- From Hand line to Game rod and Reel
- From Bath Tub to Game Boat

Get up -- get sorted - go fishing - go often - good luck

In addition he has fished Thompsons Creek Dam for trout, Tasmania for trout, the north coast of NSW for a length only Northern Bluefin tuna, and many, many other locations. His favourite location however is the rocks in the Royal National Park.

As well as his fishing achievements, he regularly contributes each month to this Newsletter, he spoke at the May meeting on beach fishing with the authority of an experienced fisherman and delivered as he would have at high school before he retired. He is generous with his fishing knowledge and willing to share with others. In addition to all this Phil is our scales verifier.

Well done Julian, team leader Chris will be asking you for more fish for the competition this year.





Mid week outing at Jibbon

Using fresh bait, Chris Holland, Peter Mortel and myself fished south of Jibbon Point out to the 30m depth line to catch 12 flatties (45-50cm) and 3 nice red rock cod, with plenty of legal throw-backs.

Water temperature was just under 18º and a cold wind arrived early (contrary to the predictions) but it didn't last long. Later sunshine saw a great day on the water.



All winter wash fishing at the moment Bill. Plenty of bread burley and then unweighted or lightly weighted baits of crab, cunjevoi, prawns or bread. In really rough bottom areas I'll use a bobby cork. I'm targeting rock blackfish

(drummer) as its one of my favourite table fish and a great fighter.

There are plenty of bycatch species at present as trevally, luderick and groper come in on the burley but I release these as I prefer the rock blackfish. I have been getting plenty of the 30cm size but the larger ones have eluded me so far. There are still some small kings around but all undersize. Also plenty of squid but they are smaller than the large green-eyes we often get. I have been seeing some jumping makos close in on the cliffs in the Park recently, so yesterday took some whole bonito baits down

and floated them out under a balloon on the off chance of having some fun of a hookup - no takers but a pleasant day on the rocks and there is always next time. This time of the year we also do a lot of exploring for new locations along the cliffs in the chance of finding some new unique spots away from the crowds where the local fish species have not been decimated by the weekend crowds.

Golden Brick Award

TRAILER PARKING RULES IN THE SHIRE MODIFIED

New regulations on parking boat trailers in streets of Sutherland Shire, which start on July 1, have been slightly relaxed since the original proposal.

Owners or users will be able to park a trailer immediately in front of their property indefinitely unless it is causing an obstruction or safety issue.

If those conditions are not met, the trailer will have to be moved to a different block at least every 28 days. Officers will begin enforcing Section 15A of the Impounding Act 1993 on July 1.

The council says it has developed clear guidelines on circumstances where action will be taken.

"If a boat trailer is causing an obstruction or safety issue to traffic (vehicular or pedestrian) or is likely to be a danger to the public then it may be impounded immediately," the council says.

"Council will be reactive and will only monitor boat trailers in residential or other built up areas if they have been reported to council in contravention of the new law."

The guidelines state action may be taken to remove unattended boat trailers parked longer that 28 days, which are:

- Not being parked in the immediate vicinity of the home of the boat owner or user.
- Having impacts on limited parking in high density areas such as multi-storey unit dwellings.
- Being left unattended in and around waterways or boat ramps.
- Being left in an unsightly state of disrepair or neglect.
- A heavy or long vehicle.

The council defines "immediate vicinity" as the area of road between the property boundaries of the owner or user, and the trailer must be parked wholly within this area.


How "immediate vicinity" is defined. Source: Sutherland Shire Council

If the council officer considers a trailer to have been left in a state of disrepair or neglect, then the officer may refuse to offer a concession and may determine that it must be moved or repaired.

Summing up, the council says, "If you cannot park your boat trailer in the immediate vicinity of your property or on private property, you will need to move your boat trailer every 28 days at least as far as a different block section of the same street.

"If this does not happen, the boat trailer (and any boat it carries) may be impounded".

The council says, at this stage, it will not be issuing residential parking permits for boat trailers

ST GEORGE SFC - LENGTH ONLY COMPETITION - RULES 2017/18

Throughout 2017/18, all members of St George SFC are invited to participate in a Length Only Competition. There will be three separate divisions:

Division 1: Combined length for Flathead, Snapper and Salmon

Division 2: Combined length for Bream, Whiting and Tailor

Division 3: Combined length for Bass, Trout (any) and Golden Perch (Yellow Belly)

The competition will run from 1 July 2017 to 30 June 2018. Only captures made within the 12 month period of each year's competition are eligible for inclusion.

Entries should be made using the form below, and forwarded to the Club Recorder within 35 days of the capture. Entries must be received before 14 July 2018.

Members can upgrade their entries at any time throughout the year so that only their longest capture for each species remains current.

There are no restrictions on line class.

All captures entered must be legal size.

All captures must be made in NSW or ACT waters.

Capture and release fishing is encouraged but not necessary for this competition.

There will be an overall prize in each division for the longest *combined length* of an angler's best capture of each species, i.e. a prize for the longest combined length of Flathead, Snapper and Salmon, a prize for the longest combined length of Bream, Whiting and Tailor and a prize for the longest combined length of Bass, Tout and Golden Perch.

Example: If a member's best capture of each species over the year is a Flathead of 680mm, a Snapper of 450mm and a Salmon of 530mm then their **combined length** in Division 1 will be 1,660mm.

A certificate and two 'Champion Angler Points' will be awarded to the winner of each **species category**. No additional points will be awarded for the overall combined length winner.

Certificates issued in August, events between 1 July and 20 August



Josh Colling has been awarded his **Master 10 Angler Award** in the Trophy Length Division. Josh's 1st capture in the division was in February 2011 - a 500mm Sea Mullet. He made his 10th capture in April 2016, a King Threadfin Salmon of 1,060mm. Congratulations Josh.

And an outstanding achievement by Wayne Colling who has been awarded three Master Angler awards:

Master 10 Angler Award in the Trophy Length Division. Wayne's 1st capture in the division was a Whaler Shark (released) in January 2009. He made his 10th capture in October 2014, a Silver Trevally of 610mm.

Master 20 Angler Award in the 250 Sportfishing Division. Wayne's 11th capture was in June 1998 - a Rock Blackfish of 2.102kg on 1kg line (315.3pts). He made his 20th capture in October 2012, a Silver Drummer of 4.40kg on 2kg line (330 pts).

Master 30 Angler Award in the Gamefishing Division. Wayne's 21st capture was a Striped Marlin on 15kg line (released) in December 1998. He made his 30th capture in of a Queenfish of 2.6kg on 2kg line (195 pts) in April 2016.

New competitions for club members

I have issued the rules for the club competitions for the new fishing year. Please note that a new division has been added to the Length Only competition for freshwater species.

ANSA News

I have been asked about the difference between ANSA's Division 10 (Length Only) and Division 11 (Species). Both these divisions relate to the "trophy length" of species, rather than the traditional "line class" captures.

Division 10 allows an angler to capture 10 different species, each at least the "trophy length" specified in ANSA's rule book for that particular species. For example, a Flathead of 70cm or more, a Yellowfin Bream of 40cm or more, an Australian Salmon of 55cm or more, etc.

Division 11 is designed for anglers who repeatedly target the same species. The Masters Award is given when an angler records 10 captures of the same species, all of which are at least the "trophy length" specified. For example, 10 Whiting all 45cm or more.

NSW lengths for some species differ from the national "trophy lengths" – Bill will be providing these with a newsletter shortly.

Shorebird Of The Month

Beach Stone-Curlew Esacus magnirostris



Other Name. Beach Thicknee

Appearance. A large and stately-looking wader, standing over 30 cm tall, generally brown above and white below. There is a prominent white bar on the shoulder. The thick legs are yellowish green with prominent knees. The head is boldly patterned in black and white with a large yellow eye. The massive black bill is yellow at the base.

Habitat and range. As its name implies this bird is normally found on or close to open undisturbed beaches, but is sometimes seen on tidal mud flats, exposed reefs and among mangroves. It normally occurs on the coast from about Exmouth Gulf WA north and down the east coast to about Nambucca heads. It is not regarded as Common anywhere and is rare south of Cairns, although it has been seen in coastal Victoria as recently as late July this year.

Breeding. September to November in the East, July to October in the North. A single egg in a shallow depression in the sand, vulnerable to disturbance.

Diet. Feeds primarily on crabs, some surprisingly large, which it catches with a Heron-like lunge.

LINE CLASSES

Fishing rules as per ANSA rule book (but no line classes) and NSW Fisheries regulations. Braid type fishing lines (i.e. Gorilla Braid, Bionic Braid, Spiderwire Fusion, etc...) are permitted to be used. Other rules are as per ANSA handbook in relation to rod length, leader/trace length, number of hooks, fishing methods, etc.

ELIGIBLE SPECIES

Australian Bass, Golden Perch, Silver Perch, Catfish and Carp. All fish are to be released in good condition, except Carp which are to be killed. Bait fishing is permitted but care should be taken when using this method. **Note:** to give the released fish the best chance of survival, **circle hooks are now compulsory** when bait fishing. Dead fish (except Carp) are not eligible. Measure fish to nearest millimetre.

POINT SCORING

As per Newcastle Sportfishing Club point score sheet, **using anglers' top five fish in each category.** Score sheets are to be handed to Newcastle SFC Recorder daily (to assist with a speedy tally and not hold up the Presentation on Sunday) and by 11:15am Sunday 17th September 2017.

FISHING TIMES

Fishing cannot commence prior to 12noon on Friday 15th September 2017, and may continue until 11:00am on Sunday 17th September 2017.

BOAT SAFETY

All boats must comply with the safety requirements as laid down at any time by the NSW Roads and Maritime. Any boat owner not complying with the regulations will risk disqualification.
